Amendments consequential on provisions of the 2018 Act

Anti-terrorism, Crime and Security Act 2001

1.—(1) Part 1 of Schedule 4 to the Anti-terrorism, Crime and Security Act 2001 (extension of existing disclosure powers) ^{M1} is amended as follows.

(2) Omit paragraph 42.

(3) After paragraph 53F insert—

“**53G.** Section 132(1) of the Data Protection Act 2018.”
