The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Dirleton) Regulations 2024

Made - - - - 30th April 2024

Coming into force - - 7th July 2024

The Secretary of State has decided that it is necessary in the public interest to restrict the flying of unmanned aircraft in the area specified in regulation 3(1) by reason of the intended gathering there of a large number of persons at the Genesis Scottish Open Golf Championships.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Dirleton) Regulations 2024 and they come into force on 7th July 2024.

Interpretation

2. In regulation 3(1) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(**b**).

Restricted airspace

- **3.**—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 0400 hours on 7th July 2024 and 2100 hours on 15th July 2024 no unmanned aircraft is to fly below 1,000 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 1 nautical mile centred at 560305N 0024836W.
- (2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any unmanned aircraft flying in accordance with a permission issued by the Genesis Scottish Open event safety officer.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on the flying of unmanned aircraft in the vicinity of the Genesis Scottish Open Golf Championships, Dirleton, North Berwick by reason of the large number of persons expected to attend the event which is due to take place there between 7th and 15th July 2024 (inclusive).

The Civil Aviation Authority and the Department for Transport agree that the flying of unmanned aircraft should be restricted in the vicinity of the event for reasons of public safety.

The times mentioned in regulation 3(1) are Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) which is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).

In relation to the permission mentioned in regulation 3(2), the Genesis Scottish Open event safety officer may be contacted as notified.

Full details of this Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Aeronautical Information Circular (AIC) and Notice to Aviation (NOTAM).
