THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE (GRADING AND MARKING) (Creamery Butter) REGULATIONS, 1935, JANUARY 22, 1935, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF AGRI-CULTURE AND FISHERIES AS TO A GRADE DESIGNATION AND A GRADE DESIGNATION MARK FOR CREAMERY BUTTER.

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Agricultural Produce (Grading and Marking) Acts, 1928 and 1931, the Minister of Agriculture 21 & 22 Geo. and Fisheries hereby makes the following Regulations:—

Prescription of grade designation.

1. A grade designation to indicate the quality of creamery butter derived from cows' milk produced in England and Wales shall be as follows :-

#### SELECT CREAMERY

and the quality indicated by such grade designation shall be deemed to be the quality as described in the First Schedule hereto.

Prescription of grade designation mark.

2. The grade designation mark shall be the grade designation specified in regulation 1 above associated with the words "Empire Buying Begins at Home," and with the following mark, namely, a map of England and Wales in silhouette with the words "Produce of England and Wales" inscribed in a circle placed centrally in the map within which circle is a design representing the Union Jack, and which is more particularly described in the Second Schedule hereto.

Date of coming into operation.

3. These Regulations shall come into operation on the 22nd January, 1935.

Short title.

4. These Regulations may be cited as the Agricultural Produce (Grading and Marking) (Creamery Butter) Regulations, 1935.

SCHEDULE I

CREAMERY BUTTER DERIVED FROM COWS' MILK PRODUCED IN ENGLAND AND WALES: DEFINITIONS OF QUALITY OF SELECT CREAMERY GRADE

General Requirements		Butter which contains no salt shall be described as "un- salted."
Special Requirements	Absence of Moisture	On being pressed, the butter shall not exude beads of free moisture.
	Colour, Appearance and Finish	Colour: Even, without streakiness, mottling or stains. Appearance and Finish: Bright and clean.
	Bodyand Texture	Firm, neither greasy nor oily.
	Flavour	Clean, free from taint and ranci- dity.

## SCHEDULE II

## GRADE DESIGNATION MARK

The mark hereunder shown shall be a grade designation mark when used in association with a grade designation and with the words "Empire Buying Begins at Home."
