THE SILICOSIS AND ASBESTOSIS (MEDICAL ARRANGEMENTS) AMENDMENT SCHEME, 1939, DATED JUNE 28, 1939, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER THE Workmen's Compensation Act, 1925 (15 & 16 Geo. 5. c. 84) AND THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION (SILICO-SIS AND ASBESTOSIS) ACT, 1930 (20 & 21 Geo. 5. c. 29).

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Section 47 of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1925, as extended by the Workmen's Compensation (Silicosis and Asbestosis) Act, 1930, I hereby by this Scheme extend and vary the Silicosis and Asbestosis (Medical Arrangements) Scheme, 1931,(a) as amended by the Silicosis and Asbestosis (Medical Arrangements) Amendment Scheme, 1934,(b) as follows:

The First Schedule to the said Scheme shall be amended and take effect as if for the processes carried on in the occupations specified therein in or in connection with the Pottery Industry there were substituted the processes set out in the Schedule to this Scheme.

WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION

- 2. The requirements of paragraph 12 of the said Scheme of 1931, as amended by the said Scheme of 1934, shall not apply to a person (other than a person entering a recognised apprenticeship in any such process) under the age of 18 years who is engaged by an employer for employment in any process carried on in or in connection with the pottery industry included in the First Schedule to the Scheme of 1931 as amended by this Scheme, or transferred by his employer to employment in any such process, but shall apply to any such person on reaching the age of 18 years if he is still employed in any such process as if he were then being engaged by his employer for employment in that process and had not previously been employed in any such process.
 - 3. Paragraph 2 of the said Scheme of 1934 is hereby revoked.
- 4. This Scheme may be cited as the Silicosis and Asbestosis (Medical Arrangements) Amendment Scheme, 1939, and shall come into force on the 1st August, 1939.
