**The Foot-And-Mouth Disease (Ascertainment of Value)
(Wales) Order 2001**

The National Assembly for Wales and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, acting jointly in exercise of the powers conferred on them by sections 1 and 34(7) of the Animal Health Act 1981(a) and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, make the following Order:

Title, extent and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Foot-And-Mouth Disease (Ascertainment of Value) (Wales) Order 2001; it applies in relation to Wales and comes into force at 5pm on 22nd March 2001.

Ascertainment of value of an animal

2.-(1) For the purposes of paragraph 3(2) of Schedule 3 to the Animal Health Act 1981 the value of an animal slaughtered by the Minister because of foot-and-mouth disease shall be in accordance with this article.

(2) If the owner decides that he wishes to have the animal valued by a valuer, the value is the amount determined in writing by a valuer appointed jointly by the Minister and the owner of the animal or, failing such appointment, by a valuer appointed by the President of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors.

(3) If the owner does not wish to have the animal valued by a valuer, the value is the amount set out for that animal in the Schedule.

(4) The valuer shall be paid by the Minister.
