**The Local Authorities (Changing Executive Arrangements
and Alternative Arrangements) (Wales) Regulations 2004**

Proposals requiring a referendum

8.—(1) If the result of a referendum held by virtue of regulation 5 is to reject the proposals that were the subject of the referendum, the local authority —

- (a) must not implement those proposals; and
- (b) where the local authority is operating —
 - (i) existing executive arrangements (as summarised in its outline fall-back proposals), it must continue to operate those existing arrangements unless and until it is authorised or required to operate different executive arrangements or authorised to operate alternative arrangements in place of its existing executive arrangements⁽¹⁾;
 - (ii) existing alternative arrangements (as summarised in its outline fall-back proposals), it must continue to operate those existing arrangements unless and until it is authorised to operate different alternative arrangements or authorised or required to operate executive arrangements in place of its existing alternative arrangements⁽²⁾.

(2) If the result of a referendum held by virtue of regulation 5 is to approve the proposals that were the subject of the referendum, the local authority must implement those proposals in accordance with the timetable included in the proposals.
