**The Trinity College, Carmarthen (Designated  
Institutions in Higher Education) (Wales) Order 2007**

The Welsh Ministers, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by section 129(1) of the Education Reform Act 1988<sup>(1)</sup> and now vested in them<sup>(2)</sup>, make the following Order:

**Title, commencement and application**

1.—(1) The title of this Order is the Trinity College, Carmarthen (Designated Institutions in Higher Education) (Wales) Order 2007 and it comes into force on 1 September 2007.

(2) This Order applies to Wales.

**Designation**

2. Trinity College, Carmarthen, being an educational institution of the kind described in subsection (2) of section 129 of the Education Reform Act 1988, is designated as an institution for the purpose of that section.

This means that it is eligible to receive support from funds administered by a higher education funding council and is to be treated as an institution within the higher education sector for the purposes of the Education Acts.
