The Cardiff and Vale College (Incorporation) Order 2011

This Order is made in exercise of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by sections 16(1) (a) and 17 of the Further and Higher Education Act 1992(1) and now exercisable by the Welsh Ministers(2).

The Welsh Ministers have published a draft and summary of this Order in accordance with section 51(3)(3) of the Further and Higher Education Act 1992 and the Further Education Corporations (Publication of Draft Orders) (Wales) Regulations 2007(4).

Accordingly, the Welsh Ministers make the following Order:

Title and commencement

1. The title of this Order is the Cardiff and Vale College (Incorporation) Order 2011 and it comes into force on 8 April 2011.

New Corporation

2. On 8 April 2011 a body corporate called Cardiff and Vale College is to be established, for the purposes of establishing and conducting from the operative date a new educational institution of the same name.

Operative date

3. The operative date appointed in relation to Cardiff and Vale College is 1 August 2011, and the corporation is to conduct the educational institution of Cardiff and Vale College from that date.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order establishes a further education corporation called "Cardiff and Vale College" under section 16(1)(a) of the Further and Higher Education Act 1992 ("the Act") for the purpose of conducting the educational institution of the same name. The Order also provides for the appointment of 1 August 2011 as the operative date for the purposes of Part 1 of the Act, being the date from which Cardiff and Vale College is to conduct the educational institution of the same name.
