**The A487 Trunk Road (Corris,
Gwynedd) (Temporary Traffic
Restrictions & Prohibitions) Order
2012**

Made 28 September 2012

Coming into force 10 October 2012

The Welsh Ministers, being the traffic authority for the relevant length of the Fishguard – Bangor Trunk Road (A487) (hereinafter referred to as “the trunk road”), are satisfied that traffic in a specified length of the trunk road should be restricted or prohibited by reason of works being executed thereon.

Title, Interpretation and Commencement

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) and of all other enabling powers(2), make this Order.

1. This Order comes into force on 10 October 2012 and its title is The A487 Trunk Road (Corris, Gwynedd) (Temporary Traffic Restrictions & Prohibitions) Order 2012.

2. —(1) In this Order:

“exempted vehicle” (“*cerbyd esempt*”) means any vehicle being used by the emergency services or in connection with the works giving rise to this Order;

“the length of the trunk road” (“*y darn o’r gefnffordd*”) means the length of the A487 trunk road at Corris in the County of Gwynedd that extends from a point 10 metres south of the centre-point of its junction with the B4405 to a point 100 metres south of the centre-point of its junction with the county road known as Rhiwstaerdywyll;

“works period” (*“cyfnod y gwaith”*) means the period commencing at 08:00 hours on 10 October 2012 and ending when the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.

Prohibitions and Restrictions

3. Subject to the provisions of article 7, no person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, to be driven in the length of the trunk road.

4. Subject to the provisions of article 7, no person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle to proceed at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour in the length of the trunk road.

5. Subject to the provisions of article 7, no person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle to proceed at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour in the length of the trunk road.

6. Subject to the provisions of article 7, no person shall, during the works period, use or permit the use of a vehicle in such a way that it overtakes any other vehicle in the length of the trunk road during such times as the restriction referred to in article 5 is in operation.

Application

7. The provisions of articles 3, 4, 5 and 6 apply only during such times and to such extent as the application of the restrictions and prohibitions referred to therein is indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

8. The maximum duration of this Order shall be 6 months.
