**ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES**

**The A465 Trunk Road (Neath  
Interchange, Neath Port Talbot)  
(Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles)  
Order 2012**

*Made* 9 November 2012

*Coming into force* 19 November 2012

The Welsh Ministers, being the traffic authority for the relevant lengths of the Neath – Abergavenny Trunk Road (A465) (hereinafter referred to as “the trunk road”), are satisfied that traffic in specified lengths of the trunk road should be prohibited by reason of works being executed thereon.

**Title, Interpretation and Commencement**

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) and of all other enabling powers(2), make this Order.

1. This Order comes into force on 19 November 2012 and its title is The A465 Trunk Road (Neath Interchange, Neath Port Talbot) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2012.

2. —(1) In this Order:

“exempted vehicle” (*“cerbyd esempt”*) means any vehicle being used by the emergency services or in connection with the works giving rise to this Order;

“the lengths of the trunk road” (*“y darnau o’r gefnffordd”*) means the entire lengths of the eastbound and westbound off slip roads of the A465 trunk road at Neath Interchange in the County Borough of Neath Port Talbot;

“works period” (*“cyfnod y gwaith”*) means the period commencing at 20:00 hours on 19 November 2012 and ending when the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.

**Prohibition**

3. Subject to the provisions of article 4, no person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, to proceed in the lengths of the trunk road.

**Application**

4. The provisions of article 3 apply only during such times and to such extent as the application of the prohibition referred to therein is indicated by traffic signs.

**Duration of this Order**

5. The maximum duration of this Order shall be 18 months.
