**ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES**

**The A465 Trunk Road (Pandy to  
Llangua, Monmouthshire)  
(Temporary Speed Restrictions &  
No Overtaking) Order 2014**

*Made* 28 November 2014

*Coming into force* 4 December 2014

The Welsh Ministers, being the traffic authority for the relevant length of the Newport – Shrewsbury Trunk Road (A465) (“the trunk road”), are satisfied that traffic in specified lengths of the trunk road should be restricted or prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) and of all other enabling powers(2), make this Order.

**Title, Interpretation and Commencement**

1. This Order comes into force on 4 December 2014 and its title is The A465 Trunk Road (Pandy to Llangua, Monmouthshire) (Temporary Speed Restrictions & No Overtaking) Order 2014.

2. —(1) In this Order:

“the lengths of the trunk road” (“*y darnau o’r gefnffordd*”) means those lengths of the trunk road in the County of Monmouthshire specified in the Schedules to this Order;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means the period commencing at 00:01 hours on 4 December 2014 and ending when the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article or Schedule is a reference to the article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

### **Restrictions and Prohibition**

3. Subject to the provisions of article 6, no person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle to proceed at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour in the lengths of the trunk road specified in Schedule 1.

4. Subject to the provisions of article 6, no person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle to proceed at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour in the lengths of the trunk road specified in Schedule 2.

5. Subject to the provisions of article 6, no person shall, during the works period, use or permit the use of a vehicle in such a way that it overtakes any other vehicle in the lengths of the trunk road specified in Schedule 2 during such times as the restriction referred to in article 4 is in operation.

### **Application**

6. The provisions of articles 3, 4 and 5 apply only during such times and to such extent as the application of the restrictions and prohibition referred to therein is indicated by traffic signs.

### **Duration of this Order**

7. The maximum duration for this Order shall be 18 months.

## **SCHEDULES**

### **SCHEDULE 1**

#### **Temporary 40 mph Speed Limit**

The length of the trunk road that extends from a point 430 metres north of the centre-point of its junction with the unclassified road at Wern Gifford, Pandy to a point 718 metres north-east of the centre-point of its junction with the unclassified road at Penishaplwyd, north of Pandy.

The length of the trunk road that extends from a point 200 metres south-west of its junction with the access to the dwelling known as Crossing Cottage, Llangua to the centre-point of Llangua Bridge at the Monmouthshire/Herefordshire county boundary.

### **SCHEDULE 2**

#### **Temporary 10 mph Speed Limit & No Overtaking**

The length of the trunk road that extends from a point 200 metres south of the centre-point of its junction with the unclassified road leading to the former Lancaster Arms, Pandy to a point 200 metres north-east of the said junction.

The length of the trunk road that extends from a point 82 metres north-east of the centre-point of its junction with the unclassified road at Penishaplwyd to a point 318 metres north-east of the said junction.

The length of the trunk road that extends from a point 97 metres south-west of its junction with the access to the dwelling known as Crossing Cottage, Llangua to the centre-point of Llangua Bridge at the Monmouthshire/Herefordshire county boundary.
