**The A5 Trunk Road (Corwen,
Denbighshire) (Various Waiting
Restrictions) Order 2015**

Made 29 October 2015

Coming into force 30 October 2015

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A5 London to Holyhead Trunk Road (“the trunk road”), in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by sections 1(1), 2(1) and (2), 4(2) and 124 of, and paragraph 27 of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) (“the 1984 Act”), and after consultation with the Chief Officer of the North Wales Police, hereby make the following Order:-

Title, Interpretation and Commencement

1. This Order comes into force on 30 October 2015. The title to this Order is The A5 Trunk Road (Corwen, Denbighshire) (Various Waiting Restrictions) Order 2015.

2.—(1) In this Order –

“disabled person’s badge” (“bathodyn person anabl”) has the meaning given in Regulation 2 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Wales) Regulations 2000(2);

“parking disc” (“disg barcio”) has the meaning given in Regulation 8(5) of the Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Wales) Regulations 2000(3).

(2) For the purposes of this Order a vehicle is regarded as displaying —

(a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position if —

(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited on the dashboard or fascia panel so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle, or

(ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position in or on the vehicle so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from outside the vehicle; and

(b) a parking disc in the relevant position if —

(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel the disc is exhibited on the dashboard or fascia panel so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is clearly legible from outside the vehicle; or

(ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position in or on the vehicle so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is clearly legible from outside the vehicle.

(3) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

Prohibition and Restrictions

3. Except as provided in article 7(1) (a), (c), (d), (e), (f) and (g), no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable, police community support officer or civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait, load or unload on the sides of the lengths of the trunk road specified in Schedule 1.

4. Except as provided in article 7(1) (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f) and (g), no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable, police community support officer or civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of the lengths of the trunk road specified in Schedule 2.

5. Except as provided in article 7(1) (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f) and (g), no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable, police community support officer, or civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any of the sides of the lengths of the trunk road specified in Schedule 3 at any time between 09:00 hours and 18:00 hours on any day for a period not exceeding 1 hour in any period of 2 hours.

6. Except as provided in article 7(1) (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f) and (g) and article 7(2), no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable police community support officer, or civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any of the sides of the lengths of trunk road specified in Schedule 4 at any time between 09:00 hours and 18:00 hours on any day from Monday to Sunday, for a period not exceeding 1 hour in any period of 2 hours.

7.—(1) Nothing in articles 3, 4, 5 and 6 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of the trunk road specified in those articles for so long as may be necessary to enable —

- (a) a person to board or alight from a vehicle;
- (b) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle (with exception to Article 3);
- (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely —
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of road; or
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said lengths of the trunk road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telegraphic line as defined in the Communications Act 2003⁽¹⁾;
- (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (e) the vehicle to take petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of the trunk road;

- (f) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes; or
- (g) the vehicle stopping when the person in control of it —
 - (i) is required by law to stop;
 - (ii) is obliged to stop in order to avoid an accident; or
 - (iii) is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control.

(2) Nothing in article 6 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on any of the sides of the lengths of trunk road referred to in that article between 09.00 and 18.00 hours on any day for a period not exceeding 1 hour, subject to there being an interval of at least 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same day.

Revocation

8. The A5 Trunk Road (Various Roads, Corwen, Clwyd) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1995(1) is hereby revoked.

SCHEDULES

Lengths of the A5 Trunk Road at Corwen in the County of Denbighshire.

SCHEDULE 1

PROHIBITION OF WAITING, LOADING OR UNLOADING AT ANY TIME

1. The north side of that length of the trunk road that extends in a generally easterly direction from a point 13 metres west of the centre of its junction with Green Lane to its junction with Green Lane.

2. The north side of that length of the trunk road that extends in a generally westerly direction from a point 15 metres east of the centre of its junction with Green Lane to its junction with Green Lane.

SCHEDULE 2

PROHIBITION OF WAITING AT ANY TIME

1. The south side of that length of the trunk road that extends in a generally westerly direction from a point 60 metres east of the centre of its junction with the lane leading to Brookside Cottages to a point 27 metres west of the centre of its junction with the lane leading to Brookside Cottages.

2. The north side of that length of the trunk road that extends in a generally westerly direction from a point 60 metres east of the centre of its junction with the lane leading to Brookside Cottages to a point 32 metres east of the centre of its junction with Green Lane.

3. The south side of that length of the trunk road that extends in a generally westerly direction from a point 50 metres west of the centre of its junction with the lane leading to Brookside Cottages to a point 95 metres west of the centre of its junction with the lane leading to Brookside Cottages.

4. The south side of that length of the trunk road that extends in a generally westerly direction from a point 128 metres west of the centre of its junction with the lane leading to Brookside Cottages to a point

5. The south side of that length of the trunk road that extends in a generally westerly direction from a point 65 metres west of the centre of its junction with Green Lane to a point 138 metres west of the centre of its junction with Green Lane.

6. The north side of that length of the trunk road that extends in a generally westerly direction from a point 65 metres west of the centre of its junction with Green Lane to a point 469 metres west of the centre of its junction with Green Lane.

7. The south side of that length of the trunk road that extends in a generally westerly direction from a point 197 metres west of the centre of its junction with Green Lane to a point 469 metres west of the centre of its junction with Green Lane.

SCHEDULE 3

WAITING BETWEEN 09:00 HOURS AND 18:00 HOURS RESTRICTED TO 60 MINUTES IN ANY PERIOD OF 2 HOURS

1. The south side of that length of the trunk road that extends in a generally westerly direction from a point 27 metres west of the centre of its junction with the lane leading to Brookside Cottages to a point 50 metres west of the centre of its junction with the lane leading to Brookside Cottages.

2. The north side of that length of the trunk road that extends in a generally westerly direction from a point 32 metres east of the centre of its junction with Green Lane to a point 20 metres east of the centre of its junction with Green Lane.

3. The south side of that length of the trunk road that extends in a generally westerly direction from a point 138 metres west of the centre of its junction with Green Lane to a point 197 metres west of the centre of its junction with the Green Lane.

4. The north side of that length of the trunk road that extends in a generally westerly direction from a point 13 metres west of the centre of its junction with Green Lane to a point 27 metres west of the centre of its junction with Green Lane.

5. The south side of that length of the trunk road that extends in a generally westerly direction from a point 95 metres west of the centre of its junction with the lane leading to Brookside Cottages to a point 128

SCHEDULE 4

DISABLED PERSONS BADGE HOLDERS ONLY BETWEEN 09.00 AND 18.00 ON ANY DAY FROM MONDAY TO SUNDAY, RESTRICTED TO 60 MINUTES IN ANY PERIOD OF 2 HOURS

1. The north side of that length of the trunk road that extends in a generally westerly direction from a point 20 metres east of the centre of its junction with Green Lane to a point 15 metres east of the centre of its junction with Green Lane.

2. The north side of that length of the trunk road that extends in a generally westerly direction from a point 27 metres west of the centre of its junction with Green Lane to a point 32 metres west of the centre of its junction with Green Lane.
