**ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES**

The A494 Trunk Road (Ysgol  
Brynhyfryd and Ruthin School,  
Denbighshire) (Part-Time 20 mph  
Speed Limit) Order 2016

*Made* 18 October 2016

*Coming into force* 24 October 2016

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the Dolgellau – South of Birkenhead Trunk Road (A494) (“the trunk road”), in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by sections 84(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) (“the 1984 Act”) and after consultation with the Chief Officer of the North Wales Police, make this Order.

**Title, Interpretation and Commencement**

**1.** This Order comes into force on 24 October 2016 and its title is The A494 Trunk Road (Ysgol Brynhyfryd and Ruthin School, Denbighshire) (Part-Time 20 mph Speed Limit) Order 2016.

**2.** In this Order:

“exempted vehicle” (“*cerbyd esempt*”) means:

(a) any vehicle being used by the emergency services for the purposes described in section 87 of the 1984 Act(2);

(b) any vehicle being used for naval, military or air force purposes and are being driven by a person for the time being subject to the orders of the member of the home forces of the Crown, who is a member of the special forces—

(i) in response, or for practice in responding, to a national security emergency by a person who has been trained in driving at high speeds; or

- (ii) for the purpose of training a person in driving vehicles at high speeds.

“special forces” (*“lluoddd arbennig”*) means those units of the home forces the maintenance of whose capabilities is the responsibility of the Director of Special Forces or which are for the time being subject to the operational command of that Director.

### **Restriction**

3. No person shall drive any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, at a speed exceeding 20 miles per hour in the length of the trunk road that extends from a point 117 metres east of the centrepoint of its junction with the vehicular entrance to Ysgol Brynhyfryd, Ruthin to a point 17.5 metres east of the centrepoint of its junction with Bryn Eryl.

4. The provision of article 3 applies only during such times and to such extent as the application of the restriction referred to therein is indicated by traffic signs.
