The Welsh Ministers make the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 125 and 203(9) and (10) of the National Health Service (Wales) Act 2006<sup>(1)</sup>.

**Title and commencement**

1. The title of these Regulations is the National Health Service (Dental Charges) (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2017 and they come into force on 1 April 2017.

**Amendment to the National Health Service (Dental Charges) (Wales) Regulations 2006**

2. In regulation 4 of the National Health Service (Dental Charges) (Wales) Regulations 2006<sup>(2)</sup> (calculation of charges)—

- (a) in paragraph (1), for “£13.50” substitute “£14.00”;
- (b) in paragraph (2), for “£43.00” substitute “£44.00”;
- (c) in paragraph (3), for “£185.00” substitute “£190.00”;
- (d) in paragraph (4), for “£185.00” substitute “£190.00”; and
- (e) in paragraph (5), for “£13.50” substitute “£14.00”.

**Revocation**

3. The National Health Service (Dental Charges) (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2015<sup>(3)</sup> are revoked.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Regulations)*

These Regulations amend the National Health Service (Dental Charges) (Wales) Regulations 2006 (S.I. 2006/491 (W. 60)) (“the 2006 Regulations”).

Regulation 2 amends regulation 4 of the 2006 Regulations (calculation of charges) by increasing the applicable charge payable for a Band 1, Band 2 and a Band 3 course of treatment.

The Welsh Ministers’ Code of Practice on the carrying out of Regulatory Impact Assessments was considered in relation to these Regulations. As a result, a regulatory impact assessment has been prepared as to the likely costs and benefits of complying with these Regulations.
