**The A487 Trunk Road (Penparc,
Ceredigion) (40 mph & Part-time
20 mph Speed Limits) Order 2017**

Made 15 August 2017

Coming into force 17 August 2017

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A487 Fishguard to Bangor Trunk Road, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 84(1)(c), (1A) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Dyfed-Powys Police, make this Order.

Title, Interpretation and Commencement

1. This Order comes into force on 17 August 2017 and its title is The A487 Trunk Road (Penparc, Ceredigion) (40 mph & Part-time 20 mph Speed Limits) Order 2017.

2.—(1) In this Order:

“exempted vehicle” (“*cerbyd esempt*”) means:

(a) any vehicle being used by the emergency services for the purposes described in section 87 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(2);

(b) any vehicle being used for naval, military or air force purposes and being driven by a

person for the time being subject to the orders of a member of the armed forces of the Crown, who is a member of the special forces—

- (i) in response, or for practice in responding, to a national security emergency by a person who has been trained in driving at high speeds; or
- (ii) for the purpose of training a person in driving vehicles at high speeds;

“special forces” (*“lluoedd arbennig”*) means those units of the armed forces the maintenance of whose capabilities is the responsibility of the Director of Special Forces or which are for the time being subject to the operational command of that Director;

“the trunk road” (*“y gefnffordd”*) means the A487 Fishguard to Bangor trunk road at Penparc in the County of Ceredigion.

Restrictions

3. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 20 miles per hour on the length of the trunk road described in Schedule 1.

4. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour on the lengths of the trunk road described in Schedule 2.

Application

5.—(1) The restriction in article 3 applies only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

(2) No speed limits imposed by this Order apply to an exempted vehicle.

SCHEDULES

SCHEDULE 1

Part-time 20 mph Speed Limit

The length of the trunk road that extends from a point 130 metres south-west of the centre-point of its junction with the unclassified county road opposite Penparc Community Primary School to a point 167 metres north-east of the centre-point of that junction.

SCHEDULE 2

40 mph Speed Limit

The length of the trunk road that extends from a point 130 metres south-west of the centre-point of its junction with the unclassified county road opposite Penparc Community Primary School to a point 382 metres south-west of the centre-point of that junction.

The length of the trunk road that extends from a point 167 metres north-east of the centre-point of its junction with the unclassified county road opposite Penparc Community Primary School to a point 375 metres north-east of the centre-point of that junction.
