**The A483 Trunk Road (Llanwrtyd
Wells, Powys) (Temporary
Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2018**

Made 6 March 2018

Coming into force 12 March 2018

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the relevant length of the A483 Swansea to Manchester Trunk Road, are satisfied that traffic on a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

Title, Commencement and Interpretation

1. The title of this Order is The A483 Trunk Road (Llanwrtyd Wells, Powys) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2018 and it comes into force on 12 March 2018.

2.—(1) In this Order:

“exempted vehicle” (“*cerbyd esempt*”) means any vehicle being used by the emergency services and in connection with the works giving rise to this Order;

“the trunk road” (“*y gefnffordd*”) means the A483 Swansea to Manchester Trunk Road;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means intermittent periods commencing at 07:00 hours on

12 March 2018 and ending when the temporary traffic signs for each period of works are permanently removed.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.

Prohibition

3. No person may, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, to proceed on the length of the trunk road at Llanwrtyd Wells, Powys that extends from a point 150 metres south-west of the centre-point of its junction with the lane leading to the dwelling known as Henfron Farm to a point 250 metres south-west of the centre-point of its junction with the road leading to the dwelling known as Maes y Gwaelod.

Application

4. The prohibition in article 3 applies only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

5. The maximum duration for this Order is 18 months.
