**The A470 Trunk Road (North of
Rhayader, Powys) (Temporary
Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2018**

Made 30 May 2018

Coming into force 4 June 2018

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A470 Cardiff to Llangurig Trunk Road, are satisfied that traffic on a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

Title, Commencement and Interpretation

1. The title of this Order is the A470 Trunk Road (North of Rhayader, Powys) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2018 and it comes into force on 4 June 2018.

2.—(1) In this Order:

“exempted vehicle” (“*cerbyd esempt*”) means any vehicle being used by the emergency services or in connection with the works giving rise to this Order;

“the trunk road” (“*y gefnffordd*”) means the A470 Cardiff to Llangurig Trunk Road;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means that period commencing at 18:00 hours on 4 June 2018

and ending when the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.

Prohibition

3. No person may, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, to proceed on the length of the trunk road at Pont Marteg, Powys that extends from a point 5 metres north of the centre-point of its junction with the county road leading to St Harmon to a point 30 metres south-east of the centre-point of its junction with the access to the dwelling known as Glyn-Gwy, approximately 5 kilometres north of Rhayader.

Application

4. The prohibition in article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

5. The maximum duration of this Order is 12 months.
