**The A479 Trunk Road (Glanusk
Park to Bronllys, Powys)
(Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles)
Order 2018**

Made 11 September 2018

Coming into force 17 September 2018

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A479 Trunk Road, are satisfied that traffic on a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

Title, Commencement and Interpretation

1. The title of this Order is the A479 Trunk Road (Glanusk Park to Bronllys, Powys) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2018 and it comes into force on 17 September 2018.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” (“*y gefnffordd*”) means the A479 Glanusk Park to Llyswen Trunk Road;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means intermittent periods commencing at 00:01 hours on 17 September 2018 and ending when the temporary traffic signs for each period of works are permanently removed.

By virtue of S.I. 1999/672, and section 162 of, and paragraph 30 of Schedule 11 to, the Government of Wales Act 2006 (c.32), these powers are now exercisable by the Welsh Ministers in relation to Wales.

Prohibition

3. No person may, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle to proceed on the length of the trunk road that extends from the centre-point of its junction with the A40 at Glanusk Park to the roundabout junction with the A438 at Bronllys.

Application

4. The prohibition in article 3 applies only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

5. The maximum duration of this Order is 18 months.
