ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES

The A483 Trunk Road (Wind Street, Ammanford, Carmarthenshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2023

Made 13 October 2023

Coming into force 21 October 2023

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the relevant length of the A483 trunk road, are satisfied that traffic on a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

Title and commencement

1. The title of this Order is the A483 Trunk Road (Wind Street, Ammanford, Carmarthenshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2023 and this Order comes into force on 21 October 2023.

Interpretation

2. In this Order—

"the trunk road" ("y gefnffordd") means the A483 Swansea to Manchester trunk road;

"works period" ("cyfnod y gwaith") means the period commencing at 08:00 hours on 21 October

2023 and ending when the temporary traffic signs are removed.

Prohibition

3. No person may, during the works period, drive any vehicle on the length of the trunk road known as Wind Street, Ammanford, Carmarthenshire that extends from its junction with the A474/Tir-y-Dail Lane to a point 2 metres south of its junction with High Street.

Application

4. The prohibition in article 3 applies only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

5. The maximum duration of this Order is 18 months.
