The A487 Trunk Road (Dinas to
Newport, Pembrokeshire)
(Temporary Traffic Prohibitions and
Restrictions) Order 2023

Made 29 December 2023

Coming into force 11 January 2024

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A487 trunk road, are satisfied that traffic on specified lengths of the trunk road should be prohibited and/or restricted because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by sections 14(1), (4), (7) and 124 of, and paragraph 27 of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

Title and commencement

1. The title of this Order is the A487 Trunk Road (Dinas to Newport, Pembrokeshire) (Temporary Traffic Prohibitions and Restrictions) Order 2023 and this Order comes into force on 11 January 2024.

Interpretation

2. In this Order—

“exempted vehicle” (“*cerbyd esempt*”) means—

- (a) any vehicle being used by the emergency services;

- (b) any vehicle being used for the purposes described in section 87 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984⁽¹⁾;
- (c) any vehicle being used for naval, military or air force purposes and being driven by a person for the time being subject to the orders of a member of the armed forces of the Crown, who is a member of the special forces—
 - (i) in response, or for practice in responding, to a national security emergency by a person who has been trained in driving at high speeds; or
 - (ii) for the purpose of training a person in driving vehicles at high speeds;

“special forces” (*“lluoedd arbennig”*) means those units of the armed forces the maintenance of whose capabilities is the responsibility of the Director of Special Forces or which are for the time being subject to the operational command of that Director;

“the trunk road” (*“y gefnffordd”*) means the A487 Fishguard to Bangor trunk road;

“works period” (*“cyfnod y gwaith”*) means intermittent periods commencing at 00:01 hours on 11 January 2024 and ending when the temporary traffic signs for each period of works are permanently removed.

Prohibitions and restrictions

3. No person may, during the works period, drive any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle on the length of the trunk road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.

4. No person may, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour on the length of the trunk road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.

5. No person may, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour on the lengths of the trunk road specified in Schedules 2 and 3 to this Order.

6. No person may, during the works period, use or permit the use of a vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, in such a way that it overtakes any other

vehicle on the lengths of the trunk road specified in Schedules 2 and 3 to this Order during such times as the restrictions specified in articles 4 and 5 are in operation.

Application

7.—(1) The prohibitions and restrictions in articles 3, 4, 5 and 6 apply only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

(2) No speed limits imposed by this Order apply to an exempted vehicle.

Suspension

8. Any statutory provisions restricting the speed of vehicles on the lengths of the trunk road specified in Schedules 2 and 3 to this Order are suspended during such times as the restrictions specified in articles 4 and 5 are in operation.

Duration of this Order

9. The maximum duration for this Order is 18 months.

SCHEDULE 1 Temporary prohibition of vehicles

The length of the A487 trunk road that extends from a point 1322 metres south-west of the centre of its junction with the C3163 road to Bryn-Henllan, Dinas Cross to a point 186 metres east of the centre of its junction with the U3447 Feidr Bentick, Newport.

SCHEDULE 2 Temporary 40 mph or 10 mph speed limit and no overtaking

The length of the A487 trunk road that extends from a point approximately 1205 metres north-east of the

centre of its junction with the C3163 road to Bryn-Henllan, Dinas Cross to a point 100 metres west of its junction with the U3141 Ffordd Bedd Morris, Newport.

SCHEDULE 3

Temporary 10 mph speed limit and no overtaking

The length of the A487 trunk road that extends from a point approximately 1322 metres south-west of the centre of its junction with the C3163 road to Bryn-Henllan, Dinas Cross to a point approximately 1205 metres north-east of the centre of that junction.

The length of the trunk road that extends from a point 100 metres west of its junction the U3141 Ffordd Bedd Morris, Newport to a point 185 metres east of the centre of its junction with the U3447 Feidr Bentick, Newport.
