

Habeas Corpus Act (Ireland) 1781 (I)

1781 CHAPTER 11 21 and 22 Geo 3

XV Persons committed for being accessary before the fact to petty treason, felony, or murder, &c. not intitled to benefit of this act. N.I.

^{F1} where any person shall appear to be committed by any judge or justice of the peace, and charged [^{F2}with any arrestable offence, which offence] shall be plainly and specially expressed in the warrant of commitment, that such person shall not be removed or bailed by virtue of this act, or in any other manner than they might have been before the making of this act.
