



# Claim of Right Act 1689

## 1689 CHAPTER 28

By Subverting the right of the Royal Burghs The third Estate of Parliament imposing upon them not only magistrats But also the wholl toune Council and Clerks contrary to their liberties and express chartours without the pretence either of sentence surrender or consent so that the Commissioners to Parliaments being chosen by the magistrats and Council The King might in effect alswell nominat that entire Estate of Parliament and many of the saids magistrats put in by him were avowed papists and the Burghes were forced to pay money for the letters Imposing these illegall magistrats and Councils upon them
