CHAPTER 56

SERVANTS' CHARACTERS ACT 1792 (REPEALED)

- [1.] Any person personating a master, &c. or giving a false character to a
servant;
2 or asserting that a servant has been hired for a period of time, or in a
station;
3 or was discharged at any other time, or had not been hired in any
previous service; contrary to the fact;
4 or any person offering himself as a servant, pretending to have served
where he has not served, or with a false certificate, or who shall alter
any certificate;
5 or who having been before in service shall pretend not to have been in
such service;
6 shall, on conviction, forfeit 20
7
8 Offenders discovering accomplices before information indemnified.
