OFFENCES TO WHICH PARAGRAPH (d) OF SUB-SECTION
(3) OF SECTION TWO APPLIES

Offences under sections forty-seven to fifty-six of the Offences against the Person Act, 1861.

Robbery, blackmail and burglary, and offences in the Republic of Ireland substantially corresponding thereto.]

Offences in Scotland involving personal violence or lewd, indecent, or libidinous conduct, or dishonest appropriation...

Offences under the Street Collections Regulation (Scotland) Act, 1915. Offences under section five of the Police, Factories, &c. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1916. Offences under the House to House Collections Act, 1939.
