26 Extension of summary jurisdiction in respect of malicious damage.

- (1) If any person wilfully or maliciously commits any damage to any real or personal property whatsoever, either of a public or private nature, and the amount of the damage does not, in the opinion of the court, [^{F1} exceed^{F2} £1000]^{F2}, he shall be liable on summary conviction to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding^{F3} level 3 on the standard scale^{F3}.]
