#### **26 Extension of summary jurisdiction in respect of malicious damage.**

- (1) If any person wilfully or maliciously commits any damage to any real or personal property whatsoever, either of a public or private nature, and the amount of the damage does not, in the opinion of the court, [<sup>F1</sup> exceed<sup>F2</sup> £1000]<sup>F2</sup>, he shall be liable on summary conviction to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding<sup>F3</sup> level 3 on the standard scale<sup>F3</sup>.
