SCHEDULE 1  
SCOTTISH PARLIAMENTARY PENSION SCHEME

PART I

ILL-HEALTH

*Serious ill-health pension*

47 An individual is entitled to a serious ill-health pension if the Fund trustees are satisfied that the following conditions are met—

---

<i>Condition 1</i>	The individual resigns as or otherwise stops being an MSP or, as the case may be, the holder of a pensionable office as a direct consequence of a health condition.
<i>Condition 2</i>	At that time, the individual would be entitled to a scheme pension but for the fact that the individual is not yet 65 years old.
<i>Condition 3</i>	The individual applies to the Fund trustees for a serious ill-health pension.
<i>Condition 4</i>	The health condition prevents the individual from doing any gainful work.
<i>Condition 5</i>	The health condition is expected to be permanent and to continue to prevent the individual from doing gainful work.
<i>Condition 6</i>	The application is accompanied by evidence that a doctor is satisfied that conditions 4 and 5 are met.
