SCHEDULE 1 SCOTTISH PARLIAMENTARY PENSION SCHEME

PART I

ILL-HEALTH

Deferred pensioner's ill-health pension

49 A deferred pensioner is entitled to a deferred pensioner's ill-health pension if the Fund trustees are satisfied that the following conditions are met—

<i>Condition 1</i>	The deferred pensioner applies to the Fund trustees for a deferred pensioner's ill-health pension.
<i>Condition 2</i>	The deferred pensioner is under 65.
<i>Condition 3</i>	The deferred pensioner has stopped doing gainful work as a direct consequence of a health condition.
<i>Condition 4</i>	At the time of stopping work the deferred pensioner would be entitled to a scheme pension but for the fact that the deferred pensioner is not yet 65 years old.
<i>Condition 5</i>	The health condition prevents the deferred pensioner from doing gainful work.
<i>Condition 6</i>	The health condition is expected to be permanent and to continue to prevent the deferred pensioner from doing gainful work.
<i>Condition 7</i>	The application is accompanied by evidence that a doctor is satisfied that conditions [^{F1} 5 and 6] are met.
