PART 3

POSTAL VOTING: ISSUE AND RECEIPT OF BALLOT PAPERS

Sealing of receptacles

- 44 (1) As soon as practicable after the completion of the procedure under paragraph 43(3) and (4), the counting officer must make up into separate packets the contents of—
- (a) the receptacle for rejected votes,
 - (b) the receptacle for postal voting statements,
 - (c) the receptacle for rejected ballot paper envelopes,
 - (d) the lists of spoilt, lost and superseded postal ballot papers,
 - (e) the receptacle for rejected votes (verification procedure), and
 - (f) the receptacle for postal voting statements (verification procedure),
- and must seal up such packets.
- (2) Any document in those packets marked “provisionally rejected” is to be deemed to be marked “rejected”.
