GENERAL AND MISCELLANEOUS

107 Regulation-making powers

- (1) Any power of the Scottish Ministers to make regulations under this Act includes the power to make—
 - (a) different provision for different purposes,
 - (b) incidental, supplementary, consequential, transitional, transitory or saving provision.
- (2) Regulations under the following provisions are subject to the affirmative procedure—
 - (a) section 20(4),
 - (b) section 23(1),
 - (c) section 31(2),
 - (d) section 42(6),
 - (e) section 47,
 - (f) section 61(2),
 - (g) section 78(1),
 - (h) section 98(1),
 - (i) section 102(5)(b),
 - (j) section 104(1).
- (3) Regulations under the following provisions are subject to the negative procedure—
 - (a) section 41,
 - (b) section 44(2)(e),
 - (c) section 91(1),
 - (d) section 94(4),
 - (e) section 95(5),
 - (f) section 99(7),
