

Regulation of Care (Scotland) Act 2001

PART 4

GENERAL PRINCIPLES

59 General principles

- (1) The Scottish Ministers ^{F1}... and the Council shall exercise their functions under this Act in accordance with the principles set out in the following subsections.
- (2) The safety and welfare of all persons who use, or are eligible to use, care services are to be protected and enhanced.
- (3) The independence of those persons is to be promoted.
- (4) Diversity in the provision of care services is to be promoted with a view to those persons being afforded choice.
- [F2(5) In subsection (2), "care service" means a care service as defined in section 47(1) of the Public Services Reform (Scotland) Act 2010 (asp 8).]
