BE IT ENACTED by being passed by the Northern Ireland Assembly and assented to by Her Majesty as follows:

### Issue of sum out of the Consolidated Fund for the year ending 31st March 2012 and appropriation of that sum

- 1.—(1) The Department of Finance and Personnel may issue out of the Consolidated Fund and apply to the service of the year ending 31st March 2012 the sum of £15,244,040,000.
  - (2) That sum is appropriated for the purposes specified in Schedule 1.
- (3) The authorisation and appropriations in this section supersede those in section 4 of the Budget Act (Northern Ireland) 2011 and section 1 of the Budget (No. 2) Act (Northern Ireland) 2011; and, in relation to any amount specified in column 2 of Schedule 1, any increase or decrease by virtue of this section in the aggregate amount appropriated by those provisions is given in brackets after the amount.

- (4) The authorisations in this section supersede those in section 6 of the Budget Act (Northern Ireland) 2011 and section 3 of the Budget (No. 2) Act (Northern Ireland) 2011; and, in relation to any amount specified in column 2 of Schedule 2, any increase or decrease by virtue of this section in the aggregate amount authorised by those provisions is given in brackets after the amount.
- (5) In this section "resources" does not include accruing resources within the meaning of section 8(1) of the Government Resources and Accounts Act (Northern Ireland) 2001.

### Revised limits on use of certain accruing resources in the year ending 31st March 2012

- **3.**—(1) For the purposes of section 8(1) of the Government Resources and Accounts Act (Northern Ireland) 2001, this section sets the relevant limits on the accruing resources that may be directed to be used for certain purposes in the year ending 31st March 2012 in addition to resources authorised by this Act to be used for those purposes in that year.
- (2) In that year accruing resources not exceeding the amount specified in column 3 of Schedule 2 may be directed to be used for the purposes specified in the corresponding entries in column 1 of that Schedule.

  - (2) That sum is appropriated for the purposes specified in Schedule 3.

### Power of the Department of Finance and Personnel to borrow

- 5.—(1) Subject to subsection (2), the Department of Finance and Personnel may borrow on the credit of the sum specified in section 4 any sum or sums not exceeding in the whole £3,493,734,000.
- (2) Any money so borrowed shall be repaid, with any interest due thereon, out of the Consolidated Fund not later than 31st March 2013.

- **6.**—(1) For the purposes of section 6(1) of the Government Resources and Accounts Act (Northern Ireland) 2001, this section authorises the use of resources in the year ending 31st March 2013.

    - (f) the Northern Ireland Authority for Utility Regulation; and
    - (g) the Public Prosecution Service for Northern Ireland,
- in that year is authorised to the amount of £7,451,346,000.
- (3) In that year, resources may be used by a Northern Ireland department or a body or person mentioned in subsection (2) for the purposes specified in relation to that department, body or person in column 1 of Schedule 4 up to the amounts specified in the corresponding entries in column 2 of that Schedule.
