The Litter (Fixed Penalty Notices) (Scotland) Order 2014

Made - - - - 19th November 2014
Laid before the Scottish
Parliament - - - 21st November 2014
Coming into force - 1st April 2015

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the power conferred by section 88(5) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990(1) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Litter (Fixed Penalty Notices) (Scotland) Order 2014 and comes into force on 1st April 2015.

Form of fixed penalty notice

2. The form of notices under section 88 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 (fixed penalty notices for leaving litter) is prescribed in the Schedule.

Revocation of Order

3. The Litter (Fixed Penalty Notices) (Scotland) Order 2004(2) is revoked.

OFFENCE OF LEAVING LITTER

NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO PAY FIXED PENALTY

The Environmental Protection Act 1990, section 88

This notice offers you the opportunity of discharging any liability to conviction for that offence by payment of a fixed penalty. The circumstances alleged to constitute the offence are as follows ^(c)
No proceedings will be taken for this offence before the expiration of fourteen days following the date of this notice. You will not be liable to conviction for the offence if you pay the fixed penalty during that period of fourteen days.
The amount of the fixed penalty is (f). It may be paid to (g) at the following address
Payment may be made by pre-paying and posting to (h) at letter containing the amount of the penalty. Payment may be in cash or by a cheque, postal order or money order made payable to (g) (if you are sending cash you are advised to send it by registered post). Payment made in this way will be regarded as having been made at the time at which the letter would be delivered in the ordinary course of post. Alternatively payment may be made in person or by any other method.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order prescribes the form of notices under section 88 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990. A notice under section 88 may be given by an authorised person or a constable to a person who the authorised person or constable has reason to believe has committed an offence under section 87 of the Act (offence of leaving litter). The effect of giving the notice is that no proceedings shall be instituted for the offence before the expiration of fourteen days following the date of the notice, and that a person who pays the fixed penalty within that period shall not be convicted of the offence.

The Order revokes and replaces the Litter (Fixed Penalty Notices) (Scotland) Order 2004. It reflects amendments, coming into force on 1st April 2015, made by the Regulatory Reform (Scotland) Act 2014 to the effect that notices can be issued by "authorised persons", being authorised officers of a litter authority, authorised officers of Loch Lomand and The Trossachs National Park Authority, or such other persons as may be specified by order made by the Scottish Ministers.
