1835 CHAPTER 50 5 and 6 Will 4

72 Penalty on persons committing nuisances by riding on footpaths, &c.

.....^{F1} If any person shall wilfully ride upon any footpath or causeway by the side of any road made or set apart for the use or accommodation of foot passengers; or shall wilfully lead or drive any horse, ass, sheep, mule, swine, or cattle or carriage of any description, or any truck or sledge, upon any such footpath or causeway; or shall tether any horse, ass, mule, swine, or cattle, on any highway, so as to suffer or permit the tethered animal to be thereon;.....^{F2}; every person so offending in any of the cases aforesaid shall for each and every such offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding [^{F3}level 2 on the standard scale], over and above the damages occasioned thereby.
