The Trade in Endangered Species of Wild
Fauna and Flora (Council Regulation (EC)
No 338/97) (Amendment) Regulations 2021

Made - - - - 18th January 2021
Laid before Parliament 19th January 2021
Coming into force - - 14th February 2021

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by Articles 18(3) and 19(5) of Council Regulation (EC) No 338/97 on the protection of species of wild fauna and flora by regulating trade therein(1), makes the following Regulations.

Citation and commencement

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (Council Regulation (EC) No 338/97) (Amendment) Regulations 2021.

(2) These Regulations come into force on 14th February 2021.

Amendments to the Annex to Council Regulation (EC) No 338/97

2. The Annex to Council Regulation (EC) No 338/97 on the protection of species of wild fauna and flora by regulating trade therein is amended as follows.

3. In the section headed “Notes on interpretation of Annexes A, B, C and D”, in paragraph 12, after annotation #17 insert—

“#18 Excluding parts and derivatives, other than eggs.”

4. The table which sets out Annexes A to C is amended in accordance with regulations 5 to 7.

5. In the rows relating to *Eublepharidae*, for the row relating to *Goniurosaurus* spp. (II) substitute—

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations implement changes to Appendix III to the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (ratified by the United Kingdom on 2nd August 1976) which were notified to parties to the Convention on 16th November 2020 (Notification No. 2020/068) and which take effect on 14th February 2021.

Regulations 2 to 7 amend the Annex to the retained EU law version of Council Regulation (EC) No 338/97 on the protection of species of wild fauna and flora by regulating trade therein.

A full impact assessment has not been produced for this instrument as no, or no significant, impact on the private, voluntary or public sector is foreseen.
