## **COMMISSION DECISION**

## of 21 November 1975

fixing, pursuant to the invitation to tender opened by Regulation (EEC) No 2684/75, the maximum amount for the delivery of butteroil, as food aid

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community;

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 804/68 (1) of 27 June 1968 on the common organization of the market in milk and milk products, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 740/75 (2), and in particular Article 6 (7) thereof;

Whereas, pursuant to Commission Regulation (EEC) No 2684/75 (3) of 21 October 1975, the Dutch intervention agency has invited tenders for the manufacture and delivery of a lot of 150 metric tons of butteroil, as food aid, to UNICEF for India;

Whereas Article 7 of Commission Regulation (EEC) No 2247/75 (4) of 29 August 1975 on the terms of invitations to tender for the costs of manufacture and delivery of butteroil as food aid to certain developing countries and to the World Food Programme, provides that in the light of the tenders received a maximum amount shall be fixed or alternatively a decision shall be taken to make no award;

Whereas, on the basis of the tenders received, the maximum amount should be that specified below;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Decision are in accordance with the Opinion of the Management Committee for Milk and Milk Products,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

## Article 1

The maximum amount amount to be set for the purpose of awarding a contract pursuant to Regulation (EEC) No 2684/75 shall be 419 366 units of account.

## Article 2

This Decision is addressed to the Kingdom of the Netherlands.
