COUNCIL DIRECTIVE

of 28 October 1969

on the organisation of the general census of agriculture recommended by the FAO

(69/400/EEC)

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community, and in particular Article 43 thereof;

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission;

Having regard to the Opinion of the European Parliament¹;

Whereas the Conference of the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organisation recommended in its Resolution No 3/65, adopted in November 1965, the period about 1970 for the next decennial world census of agriculture; whereas the Member States of the European Economic Community intend to comply with that recommendation;

Whereas that census envisages in principle the direct collection of data from all agricultural holdings by means of a complete census; whereas part of the results obtained from that census could be used for Community purposes, provided the reference period and relevant definitions are harmonised under a Community programme;

Whereas trends in the structure of agricultural holdings are an important factor in determining the course to be followed by the common agricultural policy; whereas such trends cannot be recorded unless objective and comparable data are available;

Whereas the accuracy of results must be checked; whereas Member States should accordingly take all necessary measures to trace sampling errors and to restrict and if possible estimate errors of observation;

Whereas the Community will have at its disposal, after evaluating the results of the basic survey

Whereas census data relevant to the above programme should be forwarded to the Commission as soon as possible;

HAS ADOPTED THIS DIRECTIVE:

Article 1

Member States, acting in pursuance of the recommendation of the FAO concerning a world census of agriculture, shall carry out a census of agricultural holdings situated in their territories covering one crop year being a year of which the crop is to be harvested in 1970 or 1971.

Article 2

In order to satisfy the requirements of the common agricultural policy, certain of the questions to be included in national questionnaires shall be drawn by each Member State on the basis of the Community programme set out in Annex A hereto. This programme should enable comparisons to be made in order to determine the structural development which has taken place in agricultural holdings since the basic survey prescribed by Regulation No 70/66/EEC.

prescribed as part of a survey programme on the structure of agricultural holdings by Regulation No 70/66/EEC,² as amended by Regulation No 35/67/EEC,³ certain data, which will however refer only to a specific period; whereas the aforementioned Community programme carried out again after an interval of four to five years will make it possible to obtain information on the development of certain important features recorded in the basic survey;

Article 3

Member States shall carry out the Community programme referred to in Article 2 and shall forward results to the Commission in accordance with the procedure laid down in Article 6.

Article 4

Where a Member State carries out the census by sampling, it shall show the sampling error by arranging results by class of error, the boundaries of the classes being fixed at between 0% and 5% and at 30% or thereabouts.

Article 5

For the purposes of this Directive, 'divisions' means the divisions listed in Annex II to Regulation No 70/66/EEC, as constituted at the date when this Directive is implemented.

Article 6

1. Member States shall forward to the Commission the results referred to in Article 3 in a standard form chosen by them from among the following: statistical tables, punched cards, magnetic tapes.

However, data which would make it possible to identify holdings and would thereby endanger the secrecy of the census must not be forwarded to the Commission.

2. Forwarding of the data shall be effected as soon as possible after completion of the field work.

3. Member States shall furnish the Commission as necessary with any information it may request from them concerning the performance of their tasks under this Directive.

Article 7

The data collected by Member States in the course of the census provided for in this Directive, other than data obtained by sampling, shall be available in those States classified by municipality, and shall, in so far as this is technically possible, remain so available until the next general census carried out within an FAO or Community framework.

Member States undertake that, in the event of any regional study being undertaken by the Commission, they will supply the Commission in so far as may be necessary and possible with these data, unprocessed and regrouped to cover economic and administrative units other than the divisions. In supplying the data, each Member State shall co-operate closely with the Commission; the second subparagraph of Article 6 (1) shall apply correspondingly.

Article 8

This Directive is addressed to the Member States.

Other Community Definitions

1. Table 4 (last horizontal line):

Complete sugar beet harvesting machinery

Machinery, self-propelled, tractor-drawn or tractor-mounted, for topping and lifting sugar beet, laying them in rows or collecting them in containers and/or pulverising or windrowing (longitudinally or transversally) the leaves.

Harvesting may be carried out by a single machine or by a number of separate machines (each performing a different task).

2. Table 5 (last horizontal line):

Table 16 (columns 9 and 10):

Complete potato harvesting machinery

Machinery, self-propelled, tractor-drawn or tractor-mounted, for lifting potatoes, removing haulm, laying them in rows, picking them and/or putting them into bags or boxes or in loading containers or in a trailer.

Harvesting may be carried out by a single machine or by a number of separate machines (each performing a different task).

3. Table 6 (columns 15 and 16):

Row crops grown for fodder comprise the following:

- Fodder beet and mangolds,
- Jerusalem artichokes,
- Fodder cabbages and kales,
- Swedes,
- Turnips,
- Fodder carrots,
- Other row crops grown for fodder.

Orchards comprise the following:

The fruit trees listed under heading G/01 of Annex II to the Commission Decision of 20 October 1966¹.

7. Table 15 (column 6):

Table 16 (columns 11 and 12):

Pick-up balers

Machinery, self-propelled, tractor-drawn or tractor-mounted, for gathering by continuous means windrowed crop stalks (for example hay or straw), wilted or dry, and for pressing them into bales tied with wire or twine (high and low density pick-up balers).

8. Table 22 (column 3):

Accounts means any regular and systematic recording of revenue and expenditure on closure of which the income of the holding may be determined.
