

REGULATION (EEC) No 2140/73 OF THE COMMISSION**of 3 August 1973****extending Regulation (EEC) No 1626/72 establishing Community surveillance over imports from Japan of electronic four-operation calculating machines, printing or non-printing**

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community ;

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1025/70⁽¹⁾ of 25 May 1970 establishing common rules for imports from third countries, and in particular Article 7 thereof ;

Consultations having been held within the Committee provided for in Article 5 of that Regulation ;

Whereas, by Regulation (EEC) No 1626/70⁽²⁾ of 28 July 1972, the Commission acting under the aforesaid Regulation (EEC) No 1025/70 established Community surveillance over imports from Japan of electronic four-operation calculating machines, printing and non-printing, for a period running from 1 August 1972 to 31 July 1973 ;

Whereas the reasons which led to the adoption of the system of surveillance still obtain and, as regards the new Member States, the results of this surveillance, following the enlargement of the Community, relate to a period which is not sufficient to enable definite conclusions to be reached ;

Whereas it is, therefore, in the Community interest to continue for some time yet to obtain the more important particulars concerning imports of electronic calculating machines so that market trends in this sector may be followed closely ;

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION :

Article 1

Regulation (EEC) No 1626/72 of 28 July 1972 establishing Community surveillance over imports from Japan of electronic four-operation calculating machines, printing or non-printing (Heading No ex 84.52 A of the Common Customs Tariff), is extended until 31 July 1974.

Article 2

Article 2 of Regulation (EEC) No 1626/72 is amended to read as follows :

'In the import document to be produced in accordance with Article 8 of Regulation (EEC) No 1025/70, the item "commercial description" must include details of the manufacturer and the trade mark and of the model or type of the article. It must also be stated in particular whether the machines in question are printing or non-printing.'

Article 3

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day following its publication in the *Official Journal of the European Communities* and shall remain in force until 31 July 1974.

It shall take effect from 1 August 1973.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
