## Consolidated version of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union

### PART TWO

#### **NON-DISCRIMINATION AND CITIZENSHIP OF THE UNION**

##### *Article 18*

##### **(ex Article 12 TEC)**

Within the scope of application of the Treaties, and without prejudice to any special provisions contained therein, any discrimination on grounds of nationality shall be prohibited.

The European Parliament and the Council, acting in accordance with the ordinary legislative procedure, may adopt rules designed to prohibit such discrimination.
