An Act for continuing until the First Day of *June* One thousand eight hundred and twelve, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, an Act, passed in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, to prevent Frauds and Abuses in the Admeasurement of Coals, sold by Wharf Measure, within the City of *London* and the Liberties thereof; and between *Tower Dock* and *Limehouse Hole*, in the County of *Middlesex*.

[21st *June* 1798.]

WHEREAS an Act of Parliament was passed in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty King *George* the Third, intituled, *An Act to prevent Frauds and Abuses in the Admeasurement of Coals, sold by Wharf Measure, within the City of London and the Liberties thereof, and between Tower Dock and Limehouse Hole, in the County of Middlesex*; which Act was continued by an Act passed in the Seventeenth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, to the First Day of *June* One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament: And whereas the said Act hath been found useful and beneficial, and is near expiring; may it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted;
