## GEORGII III. REGIS.

Cap. 56.

An Act for continuing until the First Day of June One thousand eight hundred and twelve, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, an Act, passed in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, to prevent Frauds and Abuses in the Admeasurement of Coals, sold by Wharf Measure, within the City of London and the Liberties thereof; and between Tower Dock and Limebouse Hole, in the County of Middlesex.

HEREAS an Act of Parliament was passed in the Seventh Preamble. Year of the Reign of His present Majesty King George the Third, intituled, An Act to prevent Frauds and Abuses in the 7 Geo. III, Admeasurement of Coals, sold by Wharf Measure, within the City of Loncited, and don and the Liberties thereof, and between Tower Dock and Limehouse further con-Hole, in the County of Middlefex; which Act was continued by an Act tinued to June passed in the Seventeenth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, to the to the End of First Day of June One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, and the then next from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament: And whereas the faid Act hath been found useful and beneficial, and is near expiring; may it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; [Loc. & Per.]

and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the said first-mentioned Act shall be, and is hereby surther continued, from the Expiration thereof, until the First Day of June One thousand eight hundred and twelve, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
