An Act for incorporating the Commissioners appointed for erecting certain Light Houses in the Northern [21st June 1798.] Parts of Great Britain.

THEREAS an Act was made in the Twenty-fixth Year of the Preamble. Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for erceling 25 Geo. 111, certain Light Houses in the Northern Parts of Great Britain: Cap. 101; And whereas another Act was made in the Twenty-eighth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act to render more effectual an 28 Geo. III, AA, paffed in the Twenty-fixth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, Cap. 25; · An Act for erecting certain Light Houses in the Northern Parts of Great Britain: And whereas another Act was made in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act to give further 29 Geo. III. Powers to the C mmissioners for creeting certain Light Houses in the Northern recited. Parts of Great Britain: And whereas great Inconveniencies have arisen in the Execution of the faid Acts, from the Commissioners thereby appointed not being made a Body Politick and Corporate, and not having a Common Seal, particularly in laying out and vesting the Surplus Money arising from the Duties granted by the faid recited Acts of the Twenty-fixth and Twenty-eighth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, in the publick Funds, as thereby directed: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the Commissioners in the said Acts men- commissioners [Loc. & Per.] 9 C

tioned, for the Purpose of better carrying the same into Execution, shall be One Body Politick and Corporate, by the Name of The Commissioners of the Northern Light Houses, and by that Name shall have perpetual Succeffion, and a Common Seal, and by that Name shall and may fue and be fued, plead and be impleaded, answer and be answered, in whatever Courts and Places, and before whatfoever Judges and Justices, and other Perfons and Officers, in all and fingular Actions, Pleas, Suits, Quarrels, and Demands, of whatever Kind, Nature, or Sort, and shall be capable in Law to have, purchase, receive, possess, enjoy, and retain, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, for making the faid Light Houses and Works, and to purchase and hold Stock, and to obtain Transfers, Affignments, or other Conveyances of the fame, and which Transfers, Alfiguments, or other Conveyances, may be made to the faid Commissioners, or to fuch other Person or Persons as they the said Commissioners, or a Quotum of them, shall, for that Purpose, under their Common Seal, appoint and authorize to receive the fame, and shall and may do all other Matters and Things whatfoever in as full and ample Manner and Form, to all Intents and Purpofes, as any other Body or Bodies Politick or Corporate, within the Realm, can or may as such lawfully do, or which they shall think necessary or convenient for making, erecting, preferring, and improving, the faid Light Houses and Works, in pursuance and within the true Intent and Meaning of the faid recited Acts, and this prefent Act.

Commissioners may retain out or the Duties the Coils of Transfers, and of this AC.

II. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Commissioners, out of the Duties by the said recited Acts granted, to retain and reimburse themselves the Costs, Charges, and Expences attending the said Transfers, Assignments, or Conveyances, and of obtaining and passing this Act, and all Expences attending the same.

Publick Act.

III. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed, adjudged, and taken to be a Publick Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such, by all Judges, Justices, and other Persons whomsoever, without specially pleading the same.
