## GEORGII III. REGIS.

Cap. 8.

An Act for increasing the Tolls authorized to be taken on the Road leading from Sevenoaks Common to the Market House in Tunbridge Town, by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for repairing the Road leading from Sevenoaks Common to Woodsgate, Tunbridge Wells, and Kipping's Cross, in the County of Kent, and from Tunbridge Wells to Woodsgate aforesaid.

[25th March 1800.]

THEREAS an Act was passed in the Thirty-third Year of the Preamble. Reign of His present Majesty, for enlarging the Term and 33 Geo. 111, Powers of an Act, passed in the Tenth Year of the Reign of recited. His present Majesty, intituled, An Ast for continuing, amending, and rendering more effectual, so much of Three Asts of Parliament, for repairing the Roads from Sevenoaks, Tunbridge Wells, and Kipping's Cross, to Lamberhurst Pound and Pullen's Hill, in the County of Kent, and to Flimwell Vent in the County of Sussex, as relates to the Road leading from Sevenoaks Common to Woodsgate, Tunbridge Wells, and Kipping's Cross, in the said County of Kent; and for amending, widening, and keeping in Repair the Road from Tunbridge Wells to Woodsgate aforesaid: And whereas several Sums of Money, borrowed upon the Credit of the said Acts, and according to the Directions thereof, still remain due: And whereas the Road leading from Sevenoaks Common to the Market House in Tunbridge Town, being Part' of the Roads comprized in the said Acts, is much out of Repair, and the same cannot be effectually amended, turned, widened, and kept in Repair, according to the Intent of the said Acts, nor can the Monies [Loc. & Per.]

Trustees empowered to take additional Tolls.

which are now owing on the Credit thereof as aforesaid be paid off, unless Power is given to take further and additional Tolls on the said Road from Sevenoaks Common to the Market House in Tunbridge Town: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That, from and immediately after the passing of this Act, it shall be lawful for the Trustees already appointed, or to be appointed to put the said former Acts in Execution, and who are also hereby appointed Trustees for putting this Act in Execution, or any Five or more of them, to cause to be demanded, received, and taken, at the Turnpike Gate erected on the said Road leading from Sevenoaks Common to the Market House in Tunbridge Town, or at any other Turnpike Gate which may hereafter be erected upon the same Road, such additional Tolls and Duties as are herein-after mentioned, before any Horse, Cattle, or Carriage be permitted to pass through the same; and that all and every the Powers, Provisoes, Clauses, Limitations, Exceptions, Exemptions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Matters, and Things whatsoever, contained or referred to in and by the said Act of the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, shall be and they are hereby declared to be in full Force and Effect with respect to the additional Toll hereby granted, as effectually as if the same were repeated and re-enacted in the Body of this Act.

Tolls to be taken at the Gate erected on the Road from Seven-oaks to Tun-bridge Town.

II. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, or any Five or more of them, or such Person or Persons as they, or any Five or more of them, shall from Time to Time authorize and appoint, to demand, receive, and take at the said Turnpike Gate such additional Toll, not exceeding One Half of the Tolls authorized to be received and taken at the said Gate, in and by the said recited Act of the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, as the said Trustees, or any Five or more of them, shall from Time to Time order and direct, in addition to and over and besides the Tolls and Duties at present collected and taken, or which may or might be collected and taken thereat by the Authority aforesaid; and to mortgage such additional Half Tolls to be taken at such Gate, by any Writing or Writings under their Hands and Seals, in Manner directed by the said Act of the Tenth Year of His present Majesty's Reign; and to lay out and expend the Money so to be raised, and the said additional Half Tolls to be collected at the said Gate, over and above and in addition to the Proportion of the Monies, which, under the Direction and Authority of the said Acts, are or ought to be laid out and expended upon the said Road from Sevenoaks Common to the Market House in Tunbridge Town, in amending, repairing, turning, and widening the said Road, and other the Purposes of the said Acts and this Act with respect to the same Road, in such Manner as the said Trustees, or any Five or more of them, shall from Time to Time order and direct.

For paying the Expences of this Act.

III. And be it further enacted, That all the Costs, Charges, and Expences incident to and attending the obtaining and passing of this Act, shall be paid, in the first Place, out of the Money to arise by the said Half Tolls to be collected or received at the said Turnpike Gate between Sevenoaks Common and the Market House in Tunbridge Town, or out of the first Monies to be borrowed on Security of the said Half Tolls.

IV. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed, ad-Publick Act, judged, and taken to be a Publick Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such, by all Judges, Justices, and other Persons, without specially pleading the same.
