An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of so much of an Act, passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, for repairing several Roads leading into the City of Glasgow, as relates to the Road from Parkhouse to or near the Three-Mile House in the County of Lanark.

[3cth June 1800.]

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of Preamble. His present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for enlarg- 34 Geo. III. "ing the Term and Powers of an Act made in the Four-"teenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled An Ast to " continue the Terms of Two Acts made in the Twenty-sixth and Twenty-" seventh Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second. " for repairing several Roads leading into the City of Glasgow, so far as the " same relate to the Roads from the City of Glasgow to Yoker Bridge, " to Renfrew Bridge, to the Three-Mile House, to the Town of Airdrie, " and from the Village of Gorballs to the Chapel of Cambulling in the "Counties of Lanark and Renfrew, so far as respects the Road from the Tollhouse in Paisley Lone at the West Side of the Entry to the New Bridge of Glasgow, by or near Parkhouse to the East End of the Bridge at Ren-" frew, and from Parkhouse to the Three-Mile House in the County of "Lanark; and for more effectually making, repairing, widening, and keeping " in Repair the said Roads," certain. Persons were nominated and appointed Trustees for surveying, making, amending, altering, widening, repairing, and keeping in Repair the Road leading from Parkbouse to or near the Three-Mile House in the County of Lanark, and Powers were given to them to levy certain Tolls and Duties on the said Road, and to borrow a certain Sum of Money on the Credit thereof: And whereas a confiderable Sum of Money has been borrowed in pursuance of the Powers granted by the said Act, which is still unpaid, and great Progress has been made in making and repairing the said Road; but the same cannot be effectually repaired and kept in Repair, nor the Money so borrowed repaid, unless the Term of the said Act of the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty, so far as relates to the said Road, be repealed, the Tolls increased, and further and other Powers granted: May it therefore please your Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent [Loc. & Per.] 20 F Majesty

Appointment of additional Trustees.

Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That besides the Persons named and appointed by the said in Part recited Act, passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, Trustees for surveying, making, amending, altering, widening, repairing, and keeping in Repair, and for causing to be surveyed, made, amended, altered, widened, and kept in Repair the said Road leading from Parkhouse to or near the Three-Mile House, and for executing all the Powers given and granted by the said Act, so far as relates to the said Road, Henry Richie Esquire of Bushie, John Mair Esquire of Plantation, and John Mair Esquire Younger of Plantation, shall be and they are hereby appointed Trustees for the same Purposes.

II. And be it enacted, That from and after the passing of this Act the said Trustees for the aforesaid Road leading from Parkhouse to or near the Three-Mile House appointed by the said in Part recited Act and by this Act, or any Person or Persons authorised by them or any Five or more of them, in place of the Tolls and Duties which they are authorised to levy by the Act herein in Part before recited, may at every Gate or Turnpike erected or to be erected by them upon or across the said Road from Parkhouse to or near the Three-Mile House, or on the Side or Sides of the same, and across any Lane or Way leading out of the same, demand, levy, and take the Tolls and Duties following, before any Horse, Mare, Gelding, Mule, "Ass, Cattle great or small, Coach, Landau, Charlot, Berlin, Chaise," Hearse, Calash, Chair, Litter, Waggon, Wain, Cart, Sledge, or other Carriage whatsoever, shall be permitted to pass through the same; that is to say,

> For every Coach, Berlin, Landau, Calash, Chaise, Chair, or Hearse drawn by Six Horses, Mares, Geldings, Mules, or other Beasts of Draught, the Sum of Three Shillings Sterling; and drawn by Four Horses, Mares, Geldings, Mules, or other Beasts of Draught, the Sum of Two Shillings Sterling; and drawn by Three Horses. Mares, Geldings, Mules, or other Beasts of Draught, the Sum of One Shilling and Sixpence Sterling; and drawn by Two Horses, Mares, Geldings, Mules, or other Beasts of Draught, the Sum of One Shilling Sterling; and drawn by One Horse, Mare, Gelding, Mule, or other Beast of Draught, the Sum of Sixpence Sterling.

> For every Waggon, Wain, Cart, Sledge, or other Carriage drawn by Six Horses, Mares, Oxen, or other Beasts of Draught, the Sum of Three Shillings and Sixpence Sterling; and drawn by Five Horses, Mares, Oxen, or other Beasts of Draught, the Sum of Three Shillings Sterling; and drawn by Four Horses, Mares, Oxen, or other Beasts of Draught, the Sum of Two Shillings and Four Pence Sterling; and drawn by Three Horses, Mares, Oxen, or other Beasts of Draught, the Sum of One Shilling and Eight Pence Sterling; and drawn by Two Horses, Mares, Oxen, or other Beasts of Draught, the Sum of Eight Pence Sterling; and drawn by One Horse, Mare, Ox, or other Beast of Draught, the Sum of Four Pence Sterling.

> For every Horse, Mare, Gelding, or Mule, laden or unladen, and not drawing in a Carriage, the Sum of Two Pence Sterling.

> For every Als laden or unladen, and not drawing in a Carriage, the Sum of One Penny Sterling.

For every Drove of Oxen or Neat Cattle, the Sum of Ten Pence Sterling per Score, and so in Proportion for any greater or less Number.

For every Drove of Calves, Sheep, Lambs, Hogs, or Goats, the Sum of Five Pence Sterling per Score, and so in Proportion for any greater or less Number.

For every Drove of Horses or Eillies unshod, the Sum of Ten Pence Sterling per Score, and so in Proportion for any greater or less Num-Fill on Institution him

III. And be it enacted, That the Exemptions from Payment of Tolls con- Repealing tained in the aforesaid Act of the Thirty-fourth Year of His present Majesty certain Exrespecting Horses or Carts or other Carriages employed in carrying upon the said Road from Parkhouse to or near the Three-Mile House, Coal and Dung or other Manure for Land, or Gardens, or Grain, Victual, or Meal, and Horses or Carriages employed in carrying Grain, Victual, or Meal to or from any neighbouring Mill, shall from and after the passing of this Act cease and determine.

IV. And be it further enacted, That the Trustees appointed by the Additional aforesaid Act of the Thirty-fourth Year of His present Majesty and Toll on Carby this Act, shall and may from and after the passing of this Act riages above levy or cause to be levied, demanded, or taken at the several Turn- Weights. pike or Turnpikes, Gate or Gates erected or to be erected on or across the aforesaid Road leading from Parkhouse to or near the Three-Mile House, before any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other Wheel Carriage drawn by One or Two Horses, Mares, Geldings, or Mules pals through the same, the Weight of which Carriage, with the Loading thereof shall exceed Twenty-one Hundred Weight, the following Tolls and Duties; videlicet,

If the Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other Wheel Carriage, with the Burden or Loading thereof, shall exceed Twenty-one Hundred Weight, and not exceed Twenty-five Hundred Weight, the Sum of Sixpence Sterling; and if the same shall exceed Twenty-five Hundred Weight, and not exceed Thirty Hundred Weight, the Sum of Ten Pence Sterling; and if the same shall exceed Thirty Hundred Weight, the Sum of One Shilling Sterling.

V. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful to and in the Part of Tolls Power of the said Trustees, or any Five or more of them, at General may be ap-Meetings assembled, from Time to Time to direct such Part of the Tolls and Duties by this present Act granted as they shall think proper, not exceeding One-Eisth Part of the Annual Produce thereof in any Roads. One Year, to be laid out and applied for the repairing other Roads within the County of Lanark, branching out of or leading into the said Road leading from Parkhouse to or near the Three-Mile House: Provided always, That no Money shall in any Case be allowed for such branching Roads, unless at a General Meeting called by Advertisement in Two of the Glasgow Newspapers. Ten Days before the Day of Meeting, in which Advertisement it shall be stated, that a Proposal for granting such Allowance is to be laid before the Meeting.

VI. And be it further enacted, That the Trustees shall have Power and Trustees may Authority to borrow upon the Credit of the said Tolls, and for the Use of borrow an the said Road leading from Parkhouse to or near the Three-Mile House, the Sum of Three I houland Pounds Sterling in Addition to the Sum which they

are empowered to borrow by the aforesaid Act of the Thirty-fourth Year of His present Majesty, and to assign over the Tolls for the Security of the Repayment thereof, with the Interest, not exceeding the Rate of Five Pounds per Centum per Annum, but without Prejudice to the Security for any prior Loan by virtue of the faid Act.

Preventing Persons riding on the Foot Paths.

VII. And he it enacted, That if any Person or Persons shall wilfully ride on Horseback upon any of the Foot Paths along the Side of the said Road hereby directed to be made and repaired, or shall drive or cause to be driven any Cart or other Carriage, or Horses or Cartle, on the said Foot Paths, it shall be lawful for any One of the said Trustees or for any Person to apprehend the Person or Persons so offending, and to carry him, her, or them before the nearest Justice of the Peace or Magistrate, who shall have Power, on Proof of the Fact by the Oath of One or more credible: Witness or Witnesses, to fine the Offender or Offenders in any Sum not exceeding Twenty Shillings Sterling for such Offence; and on Nonpayment of such Penalty to commit the Offender or Offenders to Gaol for any Time not exceeding Fourteen Days.

Powers of former Acts extended to this Act.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That all the Powers, Provisions; Clauses, Penalties, and Forfeitures granted by and contained in the said Act passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, in as far as not altered by this present Act, and in as far as the same respects the said Road leading fron Parkhouse to or near the Three-Mile House, shall continue and be exercised by the Trustees appointed by the said former Act and by this Act during the Term hereby granted.

IX. And be it further enacted, That the Expence of procuring and pences of the passing this Act shall be paid out of the Money borrowed on the Credit of the said Tolls and Duties, or out of the Tolls and Duties levied by virtue of the said former Act and of this Act.

X. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed, adjudged, and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and other Persons whomsoever, without specially pleading the same.

Commencement and Continuance. of the Acl.

XI. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence and take place on the passing of the same, and the Powers granted by the said recited Act and by this present Act shall continue for and during the Term of Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, from which Day the Term granted by the said Acts shall be repealed: Provided nevertheless, That when the said Road is completely made and repaired, and so declared to be by a Quorum of the said Trustees, and when all the Money which has been or may be borrowed on the Credit of the said Tolls and the Interest thereof shall have been paid and discharged, and all other Charges in the Execution of the former and of this present Act shall have been satisfied, then the said former Act and this present Act, and the Powers thereby granted, shall cease and determine.
