## Cap. 96.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of an Act made in the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for amending and keeping in Repair the Road from a certain Bridge over a Brook or Stream, called *Sudbrook*, near the City of *Gloucester*, to the Nine Mile Stone on the *Bristol Road*, at or near a Place called *The Clay Pitts* in the County of *Gloucester*. [30th June 1800.]

**W**HEREAS an Act was passed in the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for amending and keeping in Repair the Road from a certain Bridge over a Brook or Stream, called *Sudbrook*, near the City of *Gloucester*, to the Nine Mile Stone on the *Bristol Road*, at or near a Place called *The Clay Pitts*, in the County of *Gloucester*;" and certain Persons were appointed Trustees for carrying the said Act into Execution: And whereas a considerable Sum of Money has been borrowed, and is now due upon the Credit of the Tolls granted by the said Act, which cannot be paid, and the said Roads kept in good Repair, unless the Term of the said Act be further continued, and the Tolls authorised to be taken by the said Act increased, and several other Amendments and Alterations made to the said Act: May it therefore please your Majesty, that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the said recited Act and the several Clauses, Powers, Exemptions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Matters, and Things

Things



Things therein contained, (except such as relate to Exemptions from Stamp Duties, and also except such as are hereby varied, altered, or repealed,) shall, together with this present Act be put in Execution during the Term hereinafter mentioned, in like Manner, and as fully and effectually in all Respects, and to all Intents and Purposes, as if the said several Clauses, Powers, Exemptions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Matters, and Things contained in the said recited Act were repeated and re-enacted in the Body of this present Act; which said additional Term hereby granted shall be subject and liable to the Payment of all Monies now due and owing on the Credit of the said recited Act.

II. D. and Walter Honeywood Yate, together with such Number of Persons, not exceeding Ten, as they or any Five or more of them shall at their First Meeting nominate and appoint, shall be, and they and their Successors to be elected in the Manner mentioned in the said recited Act are hereby appointed Trustees for causing the said Road to be properly repaired and amended, and for otherwise putting this Act into Execution.

III. And be it further enacted, That the First Meeting of the said Trustees shall be holden at the *Bell Inn* in the City of *Gloucester*, on the Second *Thursday* after the passing of this Act.

First Meeting.

IV. And be it further enacted, That the Tolls granted and made payable by the said recited Act, shall, from and after the Fifth Day of *July* One Thousand Eight Hundred, cease, determine, and be no longer paid or payable, any Thing in the said Act contained to the contrary notwithstanding: and that in lieu thereof the following Tolls shall be demanded, collected, and paid: (that is say,)

Tolls granted by 19th Geo. III. to cease, and other Tolls granted.

For every Horse, Mare, Gelding, or other Beast, drawing any Carriage whatsoever, the Sum of Six Pence.

For every Horse, Mare, Gelding, Mule, or Ass, not drawing, as aforesaid, the Sum of One Penny.

For every Drove of Oxen or Neat Cattle, the Sum of Ten Pence per Score, and so in Proportion for any greater or less Number.

For every Drove of Calves, Hogs, Sheep, or Lambs, the Sum of Five Pence per Score, and so in Proportion for any greater or less Number.

V. And be it enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the Inhabitants and Occupiers of Land within the respective Parishes of *Whaddon* and *Brockthrop* in the said County of *Gloucester*, and of the other intermediate Places between those Parishes and the said City of *Gloucester*, who shall pass along a certain Lane called *Sandy Lane*, to pass and repass with any Horses, Cattle, Carts, or Carriages to and from the said City of *Gloucester*, through any Turnpike Gate or Gates to be continued or to be erected and set up, by virtue of the said recited Act or this Act, between the said Parishes of *Whaddon* and *Brockthrop* and the said City of *Gloucester*, upon Payment of Half the Tolls directed and required to be paid by virtue of this Act, any Thing hereinbefore contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

The Inhabitants and Occupiers of Land in *Brockthrop* and *Whaddon* and other Places, to pay only Half Toll.

VI. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, if they shall think fit during the Space of Three Years next ensuing, to lay out and apply the Sum of Ten Pounds yearly out of the said Tolls in the Repair of a certain Lane called *Sandy Lane*, branching out of the said Road hereby authorised to be repaired, and leading towards *Tuffleigh* and the Parishes of *Brockthrop* and *Whaddon* aforesaid.

Power for the Trustees to lay out a Sum of Money in the Repair of a Lane called *Sandy Lane*.

VII. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall, and they are hereby authorised and required to lay out and apply the Sum of Fifty Pounds yearly out of the said Tolls for the widening, amending, and repairing that Part of the Road leading from the *Hand and Post* in the Parish of *Hardwick* in the said County of *Gloucester*, towards *Stonehouse* and *Rodborough* in the said County, which lies within the said Parish of *Hardwick* and the Parish of *Haresfield* in the same County, in such Manner as they shall think proper.

Power for repairing the Road lying within the Parishes of *Hardwick* and *Haresfield*.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That all the Costs and Charges incident to and attending the obtaining and passing of this Act, shall be paid by the said Trustees, or any Five or more of them, out of the Monies al-

ready raised by virtue of the said former Act, and now in the Treasurer's Hands, or out of the first Monies which shall be collected or received by virtue of the said recited Act or this Act; and that in case any Person or Persons shall advance and pay any Money for or on Account of obtaining this Act, the Person or Persons advancing and paying any such Money shall be repaid the same out of any Monies already raised or received, or to be raised or received by virtue of the said recited Act and of this Act, together with Interest for the same, after the Rate of Five Pounds *per Centum per Annum*.

Public Act.

IX. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be adjudged and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and other Persons, without specially pleading the same.

Commence-  
ment and  
Continuance  
of this Act.

X. And be it further enacted, That this Act, except so far as relates to the Tolls hereby granted, shall commence and take Place upon the Second *Thursday* next after the passing of this Act, and together with so much of the said recited Act as by this Act is not varied, altered, or repealed, shall continue in Force for and during the Term of Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
