## GEORGII III. REGIS.

Cap. 97.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of an Act, made in the Eighteenth Year of the Reign of his present Majesty, for repairing and widening the Road from the City of Gloucester to the Town of Stroud in the County of Gloucester.

[30th June 1800.]

THEREAS an Act was passed in the Eighteenth Year of the Preamble.
Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for repair-" ing and widening the Road from the City of Gloucester to " the Town of Stroud in the County of Gloucester;" and certain Persons were appointed Trustees for carrying the said Act into Execution: And whereas a considerable Sum of Money has been borrowed, and is now due, upon the Credit of the Tolls granted by the said Act, which cannot be paid; and the said Roads kept in good Repair, unless the Term' of the said A& be further continued, and the Tolls authorised to be taken by the said Act increased, and several other Amendments and Alterations made to the said Act: May it therefore please your Majesty, that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the said recited Act, and the several Act of 18 Clauses, Powers, Exemptions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Matters, and Geo. III. and Things therein contained (except such as relate to Exemptions from this Act to be Stamp Duties, and also except such as are hereby varied, altered, or recution, for pealed,) shall, together with this present Act, be put in Execution du- keeping the ring the Term hereinafter mentioned, in like Manner, and as fully and Roads in reeffectually, in all Respects and to all Intents and Purposes, as if the said pair. several Clauses, Powers, Exemptions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Matters, and Things contained in the said recited Act, were repeated and re-enacted in the Body of this present Act, which said additional Term hereby granted shall be subject and liable to the Payment of all Monies now due and owing on the Credit of the said recited Act.

II. Meetings.

III. And be it further enacted, That the First Meeting of the said Trustees shall be holden at the Falcon Inn in the Town of Painswick on the Second Tuesday after the passing of this Act, in like Manner as was directed by the said recited Act; and that all the surve Meetings of the said Trustees, whether the same be holden by Adjournment or Notice, shall be holden within the Town of Painswick aforesaid and not elsewhere.

IV. And be it further enacted, That all and every the Tolls granted and made payable by the said recited Act shall, from and after the Fifth Day of July One Thousand Eight Hundred, cease, determine, and be no longer paid or payable, any Thing in the said Act contained to the contrary granted. notwithstanding; and that in Lieu thereof, the following Tolls shall be demanded and paid; (that is to say;)

Tölls granted by 18 Geo. III. to cease, and other Tolls

For every Horse, Mare, Gelding, or other Beast, drawing any Carriage whatsoever, the Sum of Six Pence.

For every other Horse, Mare, Gelding, Mule, or Ass, not drawing as aforesaid, the Sum of Two Pence.

For every Drove of Oxen or Neat Cattle the Sum of One Shilling and Eight Pence per Score, and so in Proportion for any greater or less Number.

For every Drove of Calves, Hogs, Sheep, or Lambs the Sum of Ten Pence per Score, and so in Proportion for any greater or less Number.

V. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That it shall and may be Tolls may be lawful for the said Trustees or any Five or more of them from Time to paid partly Time, at their Discretion, to direct that One Half of the Tolls hereby partly at angranted, shall be collected and received at some one, and the other Half other Gate, if at some other of the Turnpike Gate or Gates to be continued or erected Trustees shall by virtue of this Act.

VI. And be it further enacted, That if any Person or Persons subject to Recovery of the Payment of any of the said Tolls, shall neglect or refuse to pay the Tolls. same or any Part thereof, it shall be lawful for the Person or Persons, for the Time being appointed to collect such Tolls, by himself or themselves, or taking such Assistance as he or they shall think necessary (and which Assistance all Persons are hereby required to give if called upon) to seize and distrain any Horse or Horses, or other Cattle, upon which such Toll is by this Act imposed, together with their Bridles, Saddles, Gears, Harness, or Accourrements; and if such Tolls and the reasonable Charges of such Seizure and Distress shall not be paid within the Space of Four Days after such Seizure and Distress made, the Person or Persons so seizing or distraining shall and may sell the Horse or Horses, or Cattle so seized and distrained, or a sufficient Part thereof, returning the Overplus of the Money (if any be) and what shall remain unfold, upon Demand to the Owner thereof, after such Tolls and the reasonable Charges occasioned by such Seizure, Distress, and Sale shall be deducted.

VII. And be it enacted, That for the Passing of Cattle and Carriages Half Toll to which shall be going to or returning from any Messuage or Land be paid on within the respective Hamlets of Barton Saint Mary and Barton Saint Going to the Michael in the said County of Claucoster and not travelling further than the Michael in the said County of Gloucester, and not travelling further than Barton St. to a Bridge on the said Road, between a Messuage called The Hermitage, Mary, and situate in the said Hamlet of Barton Saint Mary, and a Messuage called Barton St. Saint Bridge, situate in the Parish of Upton Saint Leonards, in the said Michael. County, and which shall pass through the Turnpike Gate to be continued or erected in Barton Street near the said City of Gloucester, or through any Bar or Chain near thereto, there shall be demanded and taken only Half the Tolls which may in other Cases by virtue of this Act be directed and required to be paid at such Gate, Bar, or Chain.

VIII. And be it enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the The Inhabit-Inhabitants and Occupiers of Land within the respective Parishes of ants of Harf-Innabitants and Occupiers of Land Within the respective Lannies of comband Harscomb and Brocksbrop in the said County of Gloucester, or any inter-Brockshrop. mediate

and other Places, to pay half Toll.

mediate Place between those Parishes and the said City of Gloucester, to travel, pass, and repass with any Horses, Cattle, Carts, or Carriages to and from the said City of Gloucester and the said Parishes of Harscomb and Brocktbrop aforesaid or any such intermediate Place, through the Turnpike Gate to be continued or erected in Barton Street aforesaid, upon Payment of Half the Tolls which may in other Cases be directed and required to be paid at such Gate by virtue of this Act.

Tolls to be paid only once a Day.

IX. Provided also, and it is hereby enacted and declared, That all and every Person and Persons paying Toll at any one Turnpike Gate to be erected or continued by virtue of this Act, shall be at Liberty in the Course of the same Day (such Day to be computed from Twelve of the Clock at Night to Twelve of the Clock in the succeeding. Night) to pass and repass gratis with the Horse and Horses, Cattle and Carriages, in respect of which such Toll was paid through the same Gate, or through any Turnpike Gate or Gates to be continued or erected by virtue of this Act within Eight Miles of the Gate where such Toll shall be paid: And if the whole Toll imposed by this Act shall be paid at the first of the said Turnpike Gates, then it shall be lawful for all and every such Person and Persons, in the Course of the same Day, to be computed as aforesaid; to pass and repass gratis with the Horse and Horses, Cattle and Carriages, in respect whereof such Toll shall be paid through any Turnpike Gate or Gates to be continued or erected by virtue of this Act, at whatever Distance the same may be erected from the Gate at which such Toll shall have been paid, such Person and Persons. in all and every of those Cases, producing a Ticket or Tickets denoting the Payment of the said Tolls accordingly.

Expences of the Act how to be paid.

X. And be it further enacted, That all the Costs and Charges incident to and attending the obtaining and passing this Act shall be paid by the said Trustees or any Five or more of them out of the Monies already raised by virtue of the said former Act, and now in the Treasurer's Hands, and out of the first Monies which shall be collected or received by virtue of the said recited Act or this Act: And that in Case any Person or Persons shall advance and pay any Money for or on Account of obtaining this Act, the Person or Persons advancing and paying any such Money shall be repaid the same out of any Monies already raised or received, or to be raised or received by virtue of the said recited Act, and this Act, together with Interest for the same, after the Rate of Five Pounds per Centum per Annum, from the Time of advancing the same.

Public Act.

XI. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be adjudged and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and other Persons, without specially pleading the same.

Commencement and Continuance of this Act. XII. And be it further enacted, That this Act, (except so far as relates to the Tolls hereby granted), shall commence and take Place upon the Second Tuesday next after the passing of this Act, and together with so much of the said recited Act as by this Act is not varied, altered, or repealed, shall continue in Force for and during the Term of Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
