## Reviews and appeals

#### **Appeal to Social Security Commissioner**

- **15.**—(1) An appeal may be made to a Commissioner against any decision of a medical appeal tribunal under Article 14 on the ground that the decision was erroneous in point of law.
  - (2) An appeal under this Article may be made by—
    - (a) the Department,
    - (b) the person who applied for the certificate of recoverable benefits, F2 or
  - F3(c) (in a case where the amount of the compensation payment has been calculated in accordance with Article 10) the injured person or other person to whom the payment is made.
- <sup>F1</sup>(3) Subsections (7) to (10) of section 21 of the Administration Act apply to appeals under this Article as they apply to appeals under that section.
- (4) In this Article "Commissioner" has the same meaning as in section 167(1) of the Administration Act.
