**Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order
(Northern Ireland) 1977**

Made 17th June 1977

Coming into operation 21st June 1977

The Department of Manpower Services, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland) 1945(a), and now vested in it(b), hereby makes the following Order to give effect to wages regulation proposals received from the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Council (Northern Ireland).

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1977.

Commencement

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall come into operation on the specified date.

Interpretation

3. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means 21st June 1977, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

SCHEDULE

Statutory Minimum Remuneration

The Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland) 1970(c) (Order N.I.B.S. (110)) as amended by the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1975(d) (Order N.I.B.S. (125)) and the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1976(e) (Order N.I.B.S. (127)) shall have effect as if in the Schedule thereto there was inserted a new paragraph as follows:—

Paragraph 1B.

“Attack on Inflation—The Second Year” Supplement

In addition to the remuneration specified elsewhere there shall be paid a supplement entitled “Attack on Inflation—The Second Year” Supplement as follows:—

- (i) *All workers 18 years of age and over—whichever is the greater of—*
- (a)
- OR**
- (b) *5% of the worker's total gross earning for all hours worked subject to a maximum of £4.00 per week.*

(ii) *Workers aged:—*

- 17 and under 18 years of age*
- Under 17 years of age*

<i>Per hour, subject to a maximum of 40 hours per week</i>
<i>6.25p</i>
<i>5.00p</i>
<i>4.375p</i>

- (iii) *The “Attack on Inflation” and the “Attack on Inflation—The Second Year” Supplements shall not be taken into account in calculating the overtime rates payable under paragraph 30 of this Schedule.*

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order comes into operation on 21st June 1977.

The Schedule amends the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland) 1970 (Order N.I.B.S. (110)) as amended by the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1975 (Order N.I.B.S. (125)) and the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1976 (Order N.I.B.S. (127)) by increasing the statutory minimum remuneration fixed by those Orders.

New provisions in the Schedule are printed in italics.
