WAGES COUNCILS

Paper Box Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1977

The Department of Manpower Services, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland) 1945(a), and now vested in it(b) hereby makes the following Order to give effect to wages regulation proposals received from the Paper Box Wages Council (Northern Ireland):—

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Paper Box Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1977.

Commencement

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall come into operation on the specified date.

Interpretation

3. In this Order, the expression "the specified date" means 19th July 1977, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

SCHEDULE

Statutory Minimum Remuneration

The Paper Box Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland) 1975(c) (Order N.I.B. (102)) shall have effect as if in the Schedule there was inserted, after paragraph 1, the following paragraph:—

Paragraph 1A.

"Attack on Inflation" Supplement

In addition to the remuneration specified elsewhere in this Schedule there shall be paid a supplement, entitled "Attack on Inflation" Supplement, as follows:—	
(i) All workers other than trainees	£2-50
	Supplement per week of 40 hours or more
(ii) Trainees 18 years of age and over	£2·50

(iii) Trainees:-

Trainees entering, or who have entered the trade	Under 17 years	17 and under 18 years

If a trainee reaches the age of 18 before the completion of any or all of these periods then his supplement automatically becomes £2.50 per week from the date of the trainee's 18th birthday.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order comes into operation on 19th July 1977.

The Schedule amends the Paper Box Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland) 1975 (Order N.I.B. (102)) by increasing the statutory minimum remuneration fixed by that Order.

New provisions in the Schedule are printed in italics.
