ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

Prohibition of Traffic (Edgarstown Road Bridge, Portadown) Order
(Northern Ireland) 1980

Made 17th December 1980

Coming into operation 2nd February 1981

The Department of the Environment being satisfied that the use of the road described in article 2 ought to be restricted for the purpose of facilitating the movement of pedestrian traffic on that road and after giving public notice of its intention in exercise of the powers conferred by section 20 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970(a) and now vested in it(b) and of all other enabling powers hereby makes the following order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Prohibition of Traffic (Edgarstown Road Bridge, Portadown) Order (Northern Ireland) 1980 and shall come into operation on 2nd February 1981.

Prohibition

2. Subject to article 3 no person shall cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed on the Edgarstown Road Bridge, Portadown.

Exemption

3. The prohibition in article 2 shall not apply to an invalid carriage.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

The effect of the order is to prohibit all motor vehicles from using the Edgarstown Road Bridge, Portadown, except invalid carriages.

Any person who acts in contravention of the order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £100.

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the order will, in due course, be erected on the road.
